II. Obedience

- A. What does obedience or obey, or to obey mean?
 - 1. The word that is used in Eph.6:1 means *to hear under* with the idea of to give heed, to follow, to yield. Therefore children in their obedience are to give heed, follow and yield to the authority of their parents. It could even be rendered, to place oneself under the instruction of one who is in authority.
 - 2. Pre-requisite to training to obedience.
 - a. The parents must be also hearing under.
 - b. The parents must know the objective will of God.
 - c. Guiding principles:
 - 1. De 6:4-7
 - 2. Eph 6:1-4
 - 3. 1Sa 15:22
 - 3. Hindrances to training to obedience.
 - a. **Fear of man**. The fear of criticism, rejection and false accusations of abuse with treats of legal action.
 - b. **Threatening/Repeating parent**. "The mother that first coaxes, then threatens, then bargains, then pretends to punish, then finally punishes a little is only making a bad situation worse."
 - c. **Bribing Parent**. "Brining parents barter with their children in hopes of gaining obedience. They use bribes, threats, or even scare tactics to gain temporary control of their children's behavior."
 - d. **Negotiating in Conflict**. Many parents insist on the standard of complete obedience before a conflict but are willing to negotiate the line of compliance once in the heat of battle.
