## Zechariah's 8 Visions

Last week we did an overview where we learned that the **structure** of Zechariah contains;

- an opening call to repentance 1:1-6
- 8 Apocalyptic Visions 1:7-6:15
- 2 Instructive Sermons 7:1-8:23
- 2 Prophetic Oracles 9:1-14:21

We saw that the thrust of the book really is a to proclaim to God's exiled and greatly humbled people that God will indeed save His people and restore them to Himself through the salvation He will work by His great Messiah King-Priest. Moreover, God will bless and restore His chosen nation Israel to a glory more grand and glorious than they ever have experienced in the past, a glory which beginning in Moses, is spoken of in all the major prophets Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, and Daniel but also in many minor prophets as well, and in some of the most vivid prophecies, Israel's future glory is seen most clearly in **Zechariah.** This of course will come about when Christ returns to rule all the nations of the earth from Jerusalem, "14:9 And the Lord will be king over all the earth; in that day the Lord will be the only one, and His name the only one."


Now today we embark on a look at **Zechariah's 8 "night visions."** This is a section of **Apocalyptic** text in the first

half of the book spanning 1:7-6:8. These visions that God gave him have both a historical application and a future prophetic role. That is, that they applied to the people to whom Zechariah initially wrote, and they also apply to a future time as they are filled with Messianic pictures of the role and ministry of Jesus, God's anointed King Priest who will ultimately fulfill God's eternal purpose for humanity and the world.

Now these 8 visions are connected as a whole and bear a message together which foreshadow the role and ministry of Jesus. They have a unique chiastic structure, for which I have provided a diagram for you to look at. A chiasm is a literary tool used in many places in the Bible, typically in Wisdom, Poetry, and Prophetic literature that puts an emphasis on certain parts of the whole, usually in the middle section of the chiastic structure. Here, the emphasis is on the middle section where the Messiah who will come will both "remove the sin of the land in one day" (Vision 4) and will also "rule on His throne" as a Priest King (Vision 5). This is the chiastic structure, where they have these matching paired visions which work out from the center two visions, which is how these visions put emphasis on the grand important theme of the center two visions.

These 8 Visions are actually summarized by the prophet in the text which directly follows them **chapter 6:9-15**. There we see the **emphasis** that the **chiastic structure** 

carried being restated in a prophecy about the **Branch**. The **Branch** (a term for the Messiah), will have both a **Priestly role** in **removing the sin of God's people**, and will also be a **Priest** who **rules on the throne** over God's people as **King**.



You might read these messages like this; God has destroyed your enemies, delivered you from exile, brought you back to the city and the land. He is providing comfort and assurance to you His afflicted people that His watchful eye is upon you, and He will see to your protection from your enemies. He has promised that His Temple will be rebuilt, and commissioned you to rebuild it, so you can once again worship Him and His presence can dwell among you, and you can be blessed and prosper. So get on with the work rebuilding the Temple and to restore His worship, and attend to your faithfulness to His Covenant with you.
