Abraham Righteous by Faith Romans 4:1-8

These purposes of the Law can be summed up, I think best by Calvin and Luther, who both saw the Law having a 3-fold purpose. They believed the Law still continues to serve a vital purpose for both sinner and saint. These are referred to as a curb, a mirror, and a guide.

- Curb The Law serves to curb people's sins by providing a curb of restraint, by defining a moral guideline for public law and conscience.
- Mirror The Law serves to show us our sin by defining morality for us as it exposes us to God's character and will
- Guide After we are saved, the Law provides us a fixed rule to guide us with a general knowledge of God's will for living

In today's text, Romans 4:1-8, Paul will again address the Jews and help them to see that Abraham, the revered Old Testament patriarch, was indeed the example of the righteousness that comes by faith. God justifies the ungodly and reckons righteous all who believe, apart from works. This is His gracious gift, the blessing of forgiveness and covering for sins. Grounding his argument in the life of Abraham from the Law, and quoting the Psalms, Paul convinces the Jews that this has always been the way God justifies His people.

In today's text Romans 4:1-8 we will see

Genesis 15:4-7 - 4 Then behold, the word of the Lord came to him, saying, "This man will not be your heir; but one who shall come forth from your own body, he shall be your heir." 5 And He took him outside and said, "Now look toward the heavens, and count the stars, if you are able to count them." And He said to him, "So shall your descendants be." 6 Then he believed in the Lord; and He reckoned it to him as righteousness. NASB

Romans 3:28 - 28 For we maintain that a man is justified by faith apart from works of the Law. NASB

Psalm 32:1-2 - 1 How blessed is he whose transgression is forgiven, Whose sin is covered! 2 How blessed is the man to whom the Lord does not impute iniquity, And in whose spirit there is no deceit! NASB

Galatians 3:8-9 - 8 And the Scripture, foreseeing that God would justify the Gentiles by faith, preached the gospel beforehand to Abraham, saying, "All the nations shall be blessed in you." 9 So then those who are of faith are blessed with Abraham, the believer. NASB

Galatians 2:15-16 - 15 "We are Jews by nature, and not sinners from among the Gentiles; 16 nevertheless knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the Law but through faith in Christ Jesus, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, that we may be justified by faith in Christ, and not by the works of the Law; since by the works of the Law shall no flesh be justified. NASB

Philippians 3:3, 8-10 - 3 for we are the true circumcision, who worship in the Spirit of God and glory in Christ Jesus and put no confidence in the flesh.... 8 More than that, I count all things to be loss in view of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them but rubbish in order that I may gain Christ, 9 and may be found in Him, not having a righteousness of my own derived from the Law, but that which is through faith in Christ, the righteousness which comes from God on the basis of faith,

Ephesians 1:3-8 - 3 Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has <u>blessed</u> us with every spiritual <u>blessing</u> in the heavenly places in Christ, 4 just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before Him. In love 5 He predestined us to adoption as sons through Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the kind intention of His will, 6 to the praise of the glory of His grace, which He freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. 7 In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace, NASB

Psalm 103:10-12 - 10 He has not dealt with us according to our sins, Nor rewarded us according to our iniquities. 11 For as high as the heavens are above the earth, So great is His lovingkindness toward those who fear Him. 12 As far as the east is from the west, So far has He removed our transgressions from us. NASB

Micah 7:18-19 - 18 Who is a God like Thee, who pardons iniquity And passes over the rebellious act of the remnant of His possession? He does not retain His anger forever, Because He delights in unchanging love. 19 He will again have compassion on us; He will tread our iniquities under foot. Yes, Thou wilt cast all their sins Into the depths of the sea. NASB

Isaiah 43:25 - 25 "I, even I, am the one who wipes out your transgressions for My own sake; And I will not remember your sins. NASB

Romans 6:23 - 23 For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord. NASB

Philippians 3:3 - 3 for we are the true circumcision, who worship in the Spirit of God and glory in Christ Jesus and put no confidence in the flesh. NASB
