Great and Precious Promises 2 Peter 1:1-4

When we grow as Christians, we become more and more like Christ. We take on His virtue and we learn to put aside our sins and vices, so that we think, speak and act more like Christ. This is because there is a real internal change that God is making in us, through His Word and by His Spirit. This of course is what we call Sanctification, or image bearing, it is the work of God in making us like Jesus.

a faith of the same kind as ours

.... it is written to **Christian believers**, like Peter, who believe that **Jesus** is the **Son of God** who came to save us from our **sins** by living the **perfect life** in our place, and **died** to **pay** the **penalty** of **our sins**, so that we could be **forgiven** of **our sins** and God's **justice** could be **satisfied**, and this in fact **delivered us** from the **power** of **sin** and **death**. **Jesus**, who is also **God the Son**, proved this by His **powerful resurrection**, giving us sure and certain **hope** that His promise to give us **eternal life** is in fact real, genuine, and true. Indeed, the **tomb** is **empty**, He is **risen** and even now at the **right hand** of **God** have ascended into **Heaven**. All of this so that **God** could then **bless us** and grant us **His favor**, even **adopting us** into **His family** to become His own **children**. It is **amazing Grace** for sure! None of this is ours **because** we are **good**

people, but in spite of the fact that we are bad people, desperate sinners who need to be saved from the consequences of our own sins before a Holy God, who is our Holy Creator and the Righteous Judge of all people, who will all stand before Him in judgment. We cannot be saved in any way by our own works or good deeds, as we have already merited His divine wrath because of our sins, and therefore need a substitute to die in our place and on our behalf. This makes salvation the free and unmerited gift from God that is the only acceptable sacrifice for sins, which God Himself provided in His Son Jesus, the Lamb of God who takes away our sins. As Paul so clearly states in Ephesians

Ephesians 2:8-9 - 8 For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; 9 not as a result of works, that no one should boast. NASB

Acts 2:36-39 - 36 "Therefore let all the house of Israel know for certain that God has made Him both Lord and Christ — this Jesus whom you crucified." 37 Now when they heard this, they were pierced to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Brethren, what shall we do?" 38 And Peter said to them, "Repent, and let each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. 39 "For the promise is for you and your children, and for all who are far off, as many as the Lord our God shall call to Himself." NASB
